## Selfie Workshop

Following the show and tell by Hayling Piecemakers last year where we gazed in awe at their fantastic selfies quilt, Bourne Quilters decided that faces would be a great project for our upcoming quilt show. It didn't take much to persuade Jane and Barbara to help us achieve this by running a workshop for us.

On Saturday 20th January 20 keen BQ members arrived at Westbourne Parish Hall armed with their sewing machines and an array of skin toned fabrics eager to get started on their portraits. The first thing we needed to do was get our pencils out and using our photos or a mirror start drawing. Who knew that our eyes are actually in the middle of our head and are not much higher up! Then the fun really began. Using a skin-toned fabric as the base for our faces we cut out ever smaller pieces of fabric for our eyes, irises and pupils before either glueing or ironing them together with bondaweb and then attaching them to our faces. The noses and lips followed, and for those with short hair, ears. The hair was an opportunity to really run riot. Would it be a single piece of fabric with detail added by stitching? Or maybe individual strands of fabric appliqued? Scraps covered with netting, curly or straight, highlights or streaks - there were endless possibilities. The more artistic amongst us were able to be very creative with their glasses, earrings, necklaces, jewellery and any other accessories they could embellish their portraits with.

By the end of the workshop, many of the selfies were well on their way to being finished and some were already very recognisable. It was a fantastic day all round and we look forward to seeing the completed portraits. Thanks once again to Jane and Barbara from Hayling Piecemakers for their assistance and encouragement. We look forward to seeing the results at the Show in July!

## Bourne Quilters Library

The eagle eyed amongst you may have spotted the boxes of books that appear at our monthly meetings. They are often tucked away in the corner and some of you may have missed them or wondered what they are. They are the Bourne Quilters Library. Whilst many of us will have collected a number of books, patterns and other resources ourselves, sometimes you don't have exactly what you are looking for. As we all know, there is a lot of information available online and Facebook, Pinterest and YouTube can all be really useful. However this is not for everyone and sometimes a book works best. The library contains a selection of books on different techniques which are useful if you are trying something new or need a refresher or update. There are also books for inspiration with sometimes unusual uses of fabrics that might prompt you to finally make a start on that project that you always wanted to make.

To borrow a book, simply take the card from inside the front cover and write your name and the date you are borrowing the book and then put the card in the card index file. When you return the book, retrieve the card from the box and add the date you are returning the book and replace the card inside the front cover. There are no restrictions on how long you can borrow the book for as we know that projects can sometimes take longer than you think, but we would ask that you return the book once you have finished with it so that others may borrow it (Hangs head in shame as I admit to having a book for a year, but in my defence I did make 2 things from it). If you are not sure about borrowing a book just ask one of the committee.

If you do make something and have used one of the books for inspiration or to use a technique, please bring your finished piece to show and tell and let others know you found the library useful.

We also have a selection of quilting based novels by Jennifer Chiaverini which quite a few members have borrowed and enjoyed.

# ITS SHOWTIME – Our quilt show is this year!

The charity quilt will be quilted this month and then the binding put on. It will be on show at the Monday February 5<sup>th</sup> meeting so you can see progress so far. During the day we are planning that you will be able to have a demo of all the projects and be able to take home the requirements list and any instructions.
