Anne spoke about how she had started out, like many of us, making clothes at a time when there was just little choice and it was cheaper to buy material and 'me-make'.

Like many of us she found that life sometimes got in the way of her creative journey but in the meantime her reinvented jacket won her a fantastic Janome sewing machine that helped her continue that journey.

Her talk also took some time to divert in to the mental health benefits of textile art; the mindfulness that comes out of concentrating on creating, which is called 'flow'; and the long term benefits of friendships and shared interests that come out of being part of a community (Bourne Quilters) of like-minded people.

Anne is now fully immersed (excuse the pun!) in dyeing techniques, particularly ice dyeing. She creates beautiful fabrics that show texture and colour and are then further enhanced with quilting and stitching to bring out their beauty.

Block of the Month (BOM)

With this newsletter we are launching the first Bourne Quilters Block of the Month. Each month, for 9 months, we will be introducing a new block for you to make.

Then we will look at quilting, sashing (putting together) and binding to finish your quilt.

So, by this time next year you will have a completed quilt, in plenty of time for our 2026 show!

We wanted to do something that everyone could join in with, beginners and experienced quilters alike. This project starts off with the absolute simplest of blocks so that our beginners can start to learn what goes into making a quilt and to develop the skills (and vocabulary!) needed.

Don't let this put off the more experienced among us - we will be progressing to more complicated blocks during the year so, hopefully, there will be something for everyone.

Sue Rhodes is kindly running a mini beginners' workshop on February 11th and she will be able to help with all you need to know to get started. If you have any questions about any of the blocks please don't be afraid to ask at one of our meetings. Anyone on the committee will be glad to help as, I am sure, would most of our more experienced members. The Tuesday morning Stichers group is also a great place to get help and support.

I'm really looking forward to seeing everyone's BOM developing.


