
### Meeting report - 7th October

meant that by the end of the session they had all completed a picture and some had learnt to thread the machine and moved onto playing with the stitch patterns on the machine. There were 3 teenagers who extended their picture by adding spider's webs, stitching their name or completing a design that used the pieces creatively. Thank you to all who supported them.

## Cot Quilts

Over the last few years members of Bourne Quilters have been generously giving their time to make cot quilts and incubator covers for the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at QA hospital. Recently there was a plea on Facebook for the incubator covers but some members were confused as they were not asking for the size we had previously made. Lis has kindly clarified this with QA and as the regulations have now changed they need incubator covers (dark backed) to be 27" x 33", smaller than we used to make.

If you have made any baby cot quilts for NICU at QA hospital could you please bring them along to the next BQ meeting so that we can arrange for them to be taken there. If you need a label, there will be some available.

The committee are planning a sewing day next year when we will be raiding our stashes and using simple patterns to make quilts for the NICU. This will be perfect for our less experienced quilters!
