March Meeting - Graham Parker



At the meeting on March 3rd we were entertained by Graham Parker and his friend Janice as he described his journey through quilting from his first simple 9 patch block to his more recent large quilts made from fabric that they had dyed. He showed us many of the quilts that he keeps in a cupboard. There was the one with buttons which were used to cover mistakes, the block keeper that he was very proud of but had never used. Along with many of us he used to have quilt tops that he would quilt when he was good enough, but still hadn't quilted. That's a feeling that many of us can share, but perhaps we should just do it, as it's only with practice that we will ever get good enough. Graham and Janice showed us a couple of shadow quilts that they had made, inspired by some that

they had seen at our quilt show a couple of years ago.

All in all it was a very entertaining and inspiring evening which should encourage us all to get on with our quilting.

This could be by adopting his principle of 'I like to think that I'm working in a Coronation Street knocker factory and put my foot on the pedal' or even the middle of the week approach of 'start it on a Wednesday and finish it by Friday'!!

Bring your own hand sewing or join in with the project Lisa has prepared, a delightful Easter Egg decoration in 2 sizes All you need to bring with you are: paper scissors, basic sewing kit, felt, embroidery threads and ribbons in various colours plus any beads or embellishments you would like to add.

Also, for anyone who feels unsure about this month's block of the month, or would like a little refresher, Sue Rhodes will be demonstrating how to make half square triangles (HSTs).

Sue is very good at demystifying all of the wonders of patchwork and quilting so I'm sure you'll pick up tips to make the task more manageable!!

Robina Richter will show a technique for stitching fabric shapes onto a background including curves, points and fussy cutting, that she has used to great effect on some of her beautiful quilts.

Lady Sew and Sew is Europe's biggest patchwork and quilting shop, major stockists of designers including the Kaffe Fassett Collective, Anna Maria Horner and Tula Pink, and also have huge ranges of wadding, blenders and anything else you could need. I am told they have in excess of 15000 rolls of material that cover a number of crafts. They also sell yarns and are stockist for Rowan and many other wools.

Their warehouse is equipped for group visits, they only take one at a time so we will be the only group there, we will have a dedicated room to relax in when tired of shopping and to leave your belongings safe. Free tea and coffee is available all day. You just need to take a packed lunch.

Young Quilters Saturday 29 March

It was another great workshop for Bourne Young Quilters. We had 10 stitchers making Easter and Mothering Sunday cards. As ever thank you to all the Bourne Quilters members who come along to help and are essential in making the workshop a success.

The Easter cards were made using ribbon that was stitched onto calico, it's a great way to help develop sewing machine control and stitching straight as the edge of the ribbon can be followed as a guide. Plus there is the opportunity to play with patterns on the machine and threads that are at hand to a decorative effect. Using a template the egg shape was then cut out and stuck to a hessian background and stitched on.

As Mothering Sunday was the next day it was also a great opportunity to make some cards for Mums. Its quite amazing the variety of designs that can be achieved with the same materials. The imagination of the Young Quilters, and also their clear idea of the design they want, makes working with them so easy. We told the Mums to not come in the room at the end of the workshop so we could hide the surprise from them. Although I have been told that Declan and Lily couldn't wait and Mum had an early surprise the minute they got home ❤

We need.

2 pieces – 30cms x 23cms (main bag)

2 pieces – 24 cms x 20 (flap)

2 pieces – 70 cms x 10cms (strap)

June 14th – Wendda Knapp is going to lead a project

Depending on funds for room hire we are also thinking about another workshop in July before the school holidays start.

I am very grateful that the Region 3 day that was held in March raised money for sewing machines to be purchased for Young Quilters across the region to use so we soon hope to have a further 5 machines to use that are being purchased second hand



from another region.

We use our computers, laptops, tablets and phones every day to keep in contact with loved ones and conduct our day to day business. Unfortunately, criminals all too often exploit us or work cleverly to hack and steal our online accounts.

This type of crime is called Cyber and Cyber-related crime, but this may better described as scams!


This crime type makes up a significant number of reported crimes each month and costs the public and UK economy substantial sums of money each day, week and year.

Hampshire and Isle of Wight Constabulary (part of South East Police Cyber Crime Team) have prepared a session which will cover a number of different aspects of both online and offline scams, including protecting and securing your email accounts, social media and talking through methods the criminals can use to target us all, even without using our devices.

This awareness session aims to help keep you and your online information safer and recognise when we could be being conned, otherwise known as social engineered by criminals.

Inevitably some of these offences spill over in the wider fraud arena therefore our guest speaker will touch on some of these more in-person fraud types affecting our communities.

Basic online security need not cost anything and with a few simple tips can help keep your safer and help you to spot these offences before they develop.
