It is a challenge to make sample quilts to showcase fabric whilst it is still current as many people will want to replicate the display pieces. She now has her very popular sugar and spice quilt available as a book.

TRANSFER DYING

Saturday 30th August 10-3pm

Transfer dying is a simple way of colouring fabric which is washable after ironing and (almost) mess free. The colour is painted onto paper, left to dry and then ironed on to fabric. This gives beautiful unique feature pieces for bags, patchwork items and books. for those who feel artistically challenged all you need is a simple photocopy of the design you want. I will have some suitable ones to use and colour in on that. No experience necessary, nothing to bring but your lunch. Hot drinks will be provided.
