Last Month's Meeting

On 2nd June, Elizabeth Saunders took us through her textile journey and introduced us to her take on rag quilting. Working with some of her own dyed and printed fabrics, the results were interesting and varied. Adding appliqué into the mix introduced yet another dimension. We saw how some of the more traditional blocks that we might be familiar with looked when joined as a rag quilt instead of using sashing. The back of the quilts were just as interesting as the front. Each section was quilted separately before joining, producing an effect that wasn't seen with the usual style of piecing. Then the entire quilt was quilted. This is a technique that is relatively simple to do on a domestic machine as it eliminates the need to manipulate a large quilt through a small throat. At the end of the talk, the members flocked to the tables to look more closely at the quilts that Elizabeth had shown us.

Rag Quilt Workshop 6th June



On 6th June a dozen BQ members arrived at ECC for a rag quilting workshop led by Elizabeth Saunders who had given a talk the previous Monday.

Once we had settled in we practiced on a small sample piece to introduce us to the technique used. Then we moved on to our main piece - a small rag block that could be used for a cushion or a bag. Everyone made good progress and a few brave souls were even able to experiment with simple appliqué and some more advanced techniques including circles. By the end of the afternoon, everyone had finished their blocks and were eager to show them off.

Trip to Lady Sew and Sew

At 8.30 last Saturday 30 members and friends boarded the coach in Emsworth Square and made our way, via Basingstoke to Lady Sew and Sew in Henley. Most of us hadn't been there before and were absolutely wowed at the huge variety of fabrics available. Reactions varied between those who dashed around like 'a child in a sweet shop' and those who were paralysed like 'rabbits in the headlights'! The whole day was so much fun, sharing each other's excitement over purchases as well as indulging our own 'need' to own some of the beautiful products available. The staff were great; friendly, welcoming and incredibly helpful. Tea and coffee were available all day but the glass of Prosecco was the icing on the cake! We're all now asking, "Where are we going next?"



Crafty Nomad Workshop – Shirley Quilters

I went along to the workshop run for Shirley Quilters by the Crafty Nomad. It was a fun workshop and Jo aka the Crafty Nomad was a great teacher. We did some stripped curved piecing, you may remember a Christmas project I did a couple of years ago that used this but it's always good to learn from someone else as there are tips to pick up. We then experimented with the Drunkard's Path – I have never made this so it was a steep learning curve and the reason why I went. Jo had some paper templates that she is allowed to use from Papper Sax Sten who make the templates and sell in the UK through <https://modernquiltclub.co.uk/product-category/rulers-and-templates>. These were so much easier as it allows an extra seam allowance to allow you to line things up and end up with the right size. I didn't come away with a finished product but that wasn't my aim, I just wanted to improve my curved piecing and learn the Drunkard's Path. I can highly recommend the Crafty Nomad <https://www.thecraftynomad.co.uk/>

While we have made many projects, this was the first test using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " foot (which were kindly donated free of charge by Janome). All the practice in previous workshop in stitching straight lines came into play and the results were fantastic.

This gives beautiful unique feature pieces for bags, patchwork items and books. for those who feel artistically challenged all you need is a simple photocopy of the design you want. I will have some suitable ones to use and colour in on that.
