Every year, in the autumn we hold a new members welcome evening. We do appreciate that some of you may have joined considerably earlier in the year but by doing this once a year we hope to make sure everyone who has joined gets a chance to meet other new members and some of the committee and to ask any questions they may have. Lastly and most importantly, we want to welcome you to Bourne Quilters.

This year we are holding our welcome evening on Monday 20th October 7pm to 9pm at Westbourne Parish Hall. Please note the parking arrangements for us is to park in the field behind - the entrance is to the right side the hall as you face it. You can then enter the hall from the field at the back but someone will be there to guide you if you are not sure.

September meeting

On 1st September we welcomed Christine Green who encouraged us to 'Bust the rules and get creative'. She took us on a fantastic journey through her career; working for the BBC in graphic design, making velvet scarves, and into the world of patchwork and quilting. Influenced by the Gee's Bend Quilts which were made using fabrics from old clothes, and recycled materials, and inspired by the Japanese arts of boro and kawandi, Christine is very keen on improvised quilting using every bit of whatever fabric is available including seams, shirt plackets and buttonholes; making the quilts very tactile. She found all of this a really fun way of enjoying the fabrics and the process. For her, the creative process is as much about the accidents that happen in improv piecing as well as the clever use of colour.

Christine showed us some examples of her work including a still in progress EPP hexagon quilt - 'every quilter should have one of these', made from shirts, and from velvet embellished with hand sewing. We could all also admire the trousers that she was wearing which demonstrated how you could turn boro work into wearable art.

Christine is also a cat lover and an accomplished cut paper artist and produces a range of cards.



Kawandi Workshop



On 2nd September 16 BQ sewers arrived at Emsworth Community Centre laden with bags of colourful fabric, wadding and backing ready to be introduced to Kawandi by Christine Green. She explained that this is a traditional hand stitched quilting technique that involves layering and hand sewing fabric scraps onto a base fabric with folded edges, overlapped and secured with running stitches. The corners are embellished with small fabric triangles or "phulas" giving a very distinctive feel.

The first challenge was to choose our fabric. Christine

recommended limiting this to approx 6 fabrics given the size of our finished pieces. With these decisions made we could start and over the course of the day our pieces started to come together. By packing up time most of us had made good progress, although it might take Caroline a bit longer to finish hers as she had opted to use a much larger base!

Everyone enjoyed the day and could see how versatile this technique could be both as a way of using up our scraps and as an example of relaxing slow stitching.



Show and Tell

This month's Show and Tell gave us some idea of what a multi-talented group of people Bourne quilters are!

In addition to the beautiful quilts that Frances and Karen shared with us, we were treated to leather handbag, book binding and a bag and unicorn from Alice - keen to fill her time and flex her 'other' sewing muscles now she's finished her master Quilter course!

Don't forget, it is a requirement of the venues we use that machines are PAT tested annually.

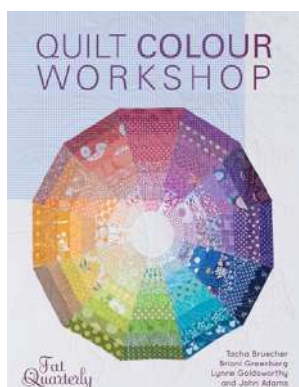
Quilting on a frame

Bourne quilters are now proud owners of 2 quilting frames that will make it possible for us to hand quilt together in much the same way as would have been done by early quilters. Hand quilting in a frame is officially on the list of threatened skills. The project to acquire a frame was kicked off by a post from Maria when the opportunity to quilt in this way and as a community project was highlighted to her during the master quilters course. The general vision is that we could work together over time at hand quilting a quilt. COULD YOU HELP? We need a few members who are interested in helping move this forward. The idea is that we would have a small group to help with ideas about how, what and when so we can get this started.

Book of the month – Quilt Colour Workshop

Other than choosing a range of light, medium and dark contrasting fabrics its always been a bit of mystery to me as to how to go about choosing fabrics. I have tended to err on the side of choosing from a range, then in part the designer has done the hard work for me.



This book is a useful guide that shares some of the secrets of using colour in quilting; about colour theory, and how to use it in the context of quilting. There are some practical projects from quilts and cushions, to wall hangings, table runners and bags. The book has six colour-themed sections with block ideas for every colour theory combination. There are also instructions for a colour wheel quilt that would be a fun and alternative way to scrap bust.

If you use one of the books in the library we would love to know what you thought of it, and if you made anything from it. You don't need to write anything, just have a word with me (Karen) and I'll put into writing your thoughts into writing.

We are also looking to invest in the library – if you have a book that you think would be worth us buying then please let one of the committee know.
